Redwood Community Services Stepping Stones: Nova Apts./Gibson House (THP+FC, THP-Plus, and TAY Wellness)

- What is provided?
 - Transitional Housing Program tailored as a mental health program.
 - Nova Apts.
 - Gibson House
 - Specialty Mental Health Services (SMHS)
 - Psychotherapy, psychosocial rehabilitation, targeted case management, BPSA, etc...
- Requirements for Youth
 - Productivity
 - Engagement
 - Sober Living

- > Who is eligible? (Note: Youth must have Mendocino Medi-Cal)
 - 18-24 years old (up to their 25th birthday).
 - THP+FC (EFC/THP-NMD/AB12 youth) (18-20 years; up until their 21st birthday).
 - THP-Plus (Youth exiting THP+FC/EFC/THP-NMD/AB12, youth not eligible for THP+FC, or youth that were part of the foster care system) (18-24 years; 36-months or up on until their 25th birthday).
 - And/or any youth within the age range experiencing homelessness, mental health challenges, substance use, and/or co-occurring disorders (Youth didn't have to part of the foster system or any of the program above to qualify) (24-month program or up until their 25th birthday).

- How do we refer a client to your program?
 - Submit online referral via online by going to https://redwoodcommunityservices.org/ then selecting "Transitional Housing."

 - Explaining that it is a mental health program.
- What is the process?
 - Submit referral and/or physical application
 - Also, being proactive by submitting a Mental Health Services Referral for our SMHS.
 - Interview
 - o If accepted:
 - Intake Paperwork
 - Schedule Move-In Date
 - Move-In
 - Grocery shopping and shopping for personal items.

County of Mendocino Project Homekey – Live Oak Apartments

- What is provided?
 - Live Oak Apartments provides transitional and permanent housing to households that are homeless or at-risk of homelessness.
 - Housing units are former, renovated, motel rooms with kitchenettes. Mostly studios, with a few two-room units.
 - Located in Ukiah; 49 total units in the building.

- > Who is eligible?
 - Must be homeless or at-risk-of homelessness
 - O Priority populations:
 - Households with children
 - Veterans
 - Seniors
 - People with complex health conditions

- > How do we refer a client to your program?
 - https://projecthomekeymendocino.org/
 - Click on "For Partners" tab for application and instructions
- > How do we guide clients to your program?
 - Clients can submit a self-referral through https://projecthomekeymendocino.org/referral/

- How can we help manage client's expectations when referring to your program?
 - Clients must contribute 30% of their income towards rent
 - The property is well-staffed, has security cameras, and has high standards for appropriate public behavior

- > What is the process?
 - All current applications on the interest list are reviewed as units become available.
 - To stay on the list, applicant must re-submit an application every 90 days

Mendocino Coast Hospitality Center (MCHC) Transitional Housing Program

- Transitional Housing operates at Hospitality North (and on the second floor of the Hospitality Center).
- Transitional Housing is an independent living program. Clients are referred from the county's Coordinated Entry process, having scored a "4" or higher on the "By Name List".
- MCHC's Transitional Housing program serves people with mental illness, and/or people with children under 18. Rent is charged per the HUD matrix at 30% of income. This is a clean and sober living program. All tenants complete chores and also voluntary work in the community.
